Mechanics of Rating

Updated information regarding the rating of this examination may be posted on the New York State Education Department's web site during the rating period. Check this web site http://www.emsc.nysed.gov/osa/ and select the link "Examination Scoring Information" for any recently posted information regarding this examination. This site should be checked before the rating process for this examination begins and several times throughout the Regents examination period.

The following procedures are to be used for rating papers in the Comprehensive Examination in English. More detailed directions for the organization of the rating process and procedures for rating the examination are included in the *Information Booklet for Administering and Scoring the Comprehensive Examination in English*.

Scoring of Multiple-Choice Questions

Indicate by means of a check mark each incorrect or omitted answer to multiple-choice questions on the Session One answer sheet; do not place a check mark beside a correct answer. Use only red ink or red pencil. In the box provided under each part, record the number of questions the student answered correctly for that part. Transfer the number of correct answers for the Part A and Part B multiple-choice questions to the appropriate spaces in the box in the upper right corner of each student's **SESSION ONE** answer sheet.

Rating of Essays

- (1) Follow your school's procedures for training for rating. This process should include: Introduction to the task—
 - Raters read the task and summarize its purpose, audience, and format
 - Raters read passage(s) and plan own response to task
 - Raters share response plans and summarize expectations for student responses

Introduction to the rubric and anchor papers—

- Trainer reviews rubric with reference to the task
- Trainer reviews procedures for assigning scores
- Trainer leads review of each anchor paper and commentary
 (Note: Anchor papers are ordered from high to low within each score level.)

Practice scoring individually—

- Raters score a set of five papers individually
- Trainer records scores and leads discussion until raters feel confident enough to move on to actual scoring
- (2) When actual rating begins, each rater should record his or her individual rating for a student's essay on the rating sheet provided, *not* directly on the student's essay or answer sheet. Do *not* correct the student's work by making insertions or changes of any kind.
- (3) Each essay must be rated by at least two raters; a third rater will be necessary to resolve scores that differ by more than one point. The scoring coordinator will be responsible for coordinating the movement of papers, calculating a final score for each student's essay, and recording that information on the student's answer paper for Session One.

After spending time with my health class exploring the needs of the community, it has come to my attention that therapy days can be used to benefit the elderly in our local long-term care facility. After hearing an account by Steve Reiman, I have become even more positive that therapy days would do so much good and to great bring great benefits to thos living in the care facility.


Reiman starts his account with there is no greater therapy than the love of a doq." He explains that the presence of therapy dogs is becoming a "powerful and common" method of therapy. Days have proven to be a "positive force in the healing process" and have had a "calming and theraputic" affect. Indeed therapy dogs have helped elders cope with emotional problems connected with their illnesses, but they also help the elderly cape with something else. As Reiman explains, therapy dogs help the people in long-term care facilities deal with their most serious problem: lonliness. Dogs are both "intuitive" and "compassionate" and are able to "love everyone without prejudice" and "diminate language barriers! Dr. Mccollochzand Dr. Corson, two active researchers on why pets are a great help in therapy, sould individuals "need to be needed" and need "to touch and be touched." They continued on to say that "touch is one of the primary needs when born, and one of the last needs to qo. "Quite often the elderly lack the feeling that they are needed, and pets "allow them to be nurterers once again." Dogs encourage physical movement, and are often the perfectect "anecdote to depression! The good they can do and the joy that they can bring to these the core facility would be greatly appreciated by those living there.

I'm sure you are questioning the safety of bringing dogs in, or the individual fears that some who live there may have, but stop right there. All therapy dogs are trained, tested, and observed. As for the personal fears of some residents, dogs are often dressed in costumes to help patients overcome their fear. Infact, Reiman has dressed his dogs as clowns and wrote about others being dressed as doctors. Everything the dogs and the handlers do is done keeping in mind the benefits of the residents. Although the effects therapy days have on patients at long-term care facilities may "be hard to tell by hard scientific facts," the "magical interactions" between the dogs and the elderly are "unmistakeable! Conclusion: Overall, the response best fits the criteria for Level 5, although it is somewhat weaker in language use and conventions.

Not many people would expect companionship to come from someone or something other than a human-being. However, there are other things to cure boredom, loneliness or a lack of a companion.
